Overcoming Spiritual Hackers Scripture Reference: Galatians 5:22-23
Teacher: Minister Devin Branch, (AR) and Sister Brooklyn Hampton (AR)

What is a Spiritual Hacker?

A hacker is an individual who uses their skills (computer) to **find vulnerabilities in existing technology to achieve a goal or overcome an obstacle**. A hacker also uses their expertise to maliciously gain unauthorized access to private data. What does a hacker look like? It used to be that hackers were often teenagers trying to break into prominent organizations simply to gain notoriety. But today's hacker community is far more diverse and made up of individuals with many different motives. This is why you have to have sound discernment. A person can have good intentions but satanic intent. In this season as young people, we may make sure we connect with the right people, places, and things.

Hackers breach defenses to gain unauthorized access to your life, just like natural hackers. They gain unauthorized access to your computers, phones, tablets, IoT devices, networks, or entire computing systems. It is a hacker's job to take advantage of weaknesses in your network.

Spiritual Hackers work to gain access to your spiritual network. What is your spiritual network? It's the church. If the enemy can stop you from connecting with the church, he can gain access to your prayer life, home life, relationships, and most of all, your spiritual life. Hackers can exploit a person's lack of reading, Bible vulnerabilities, or weak prayer practices to gain unauthorized access to their lives or inject doubt, worry, discouragement, and other spiritual malware into them.

One of the biggest hacking attacks is the social attack, you see Hackers can also use social engineering to convince those with privileged access to targeted systems. If the enemy can get you to open yourself to the wrong things, he can take down your whole spiritual infrastructure. Much like hackers use phishing to get you to click on malicious links, open infected files, or reveal personal information, thereby gaining access to otherwise hardened infrastructures. **In this session, youth will learn how to identify the tactics the enemy uses to hack into our lives.**

How do I protect against Spiritual Hackers? In this day and time, we must make time for prayer, fasting, and reading our Bible. These are the fundamental things that every Christian must have to protect themselves against Spiritual Hackers. It is our responsibility to make sure we have a personal relationship with God. We must have ongoing vigilance for the things of God. Even when it gets tough, and we don't know how or why we are under attack, we must have our spiritual "security system" built up enough to fight off the enemy's attack. In this class, we will learn the basics of building up your spiritual "software". **This session is designed to provide youth with practical tools and bible applications on how to build your spiritual man. Youth will be reintroduced to the Fruit of the Spirit Youth Galatians 5:22-23 (KJV) and they will learn why prayer, fasting, and spending time in the Word are so important.**

Topic: Building a Spiritual Defenses: Exploring the Fruit of the Spirit

Scripture Reference: Galatians 5:22-23 King James Version (KJV) These are the things we need to have strong spiritual defenses. Students will learn about the Fruit of the Spirit and how each of them work in the lives of younger youth and children. This power packed 2-part lesson will help children build their understanding and their spiritual protection from Spiritual Hackers. **Prayer:** this session is designed to provide students with tools and practical Bible application on how to navigate through all the noise so they can hear from God and clearly know that God answer prayer and help in the hard time.
